Click on a picture and use the navigation tip to progress forwards or backwards. FLAMBOROUGH HEAD - CHALK Flamborough Head is the furthest north that the Chalk of the Cretaceous outcrops in England. The Head cliffs have many caves, stacks and arches and are overlain by a glacial Till. The pictures in this gallery show some of these features.
